III SUMMER SCHOOL DI ARCHEOLOGIA – UNIVERSITÁ DI FOGGIA Aerial Archaeology Research School University of Foggia

The School

The school will take place in Foggia from the early evening of Friday 18th May to mid-afternoon on Sunday 27th May 2007. It forms part of the Culture 2000 Project 'European Landscapes: past, present and future', promoted by the English Heritage in the UK, the Universities of Foggia and Siena in Italy, the Archaeological State Museum of Mecklenburg Vorpommern and the Landesdenkmalamt Baden Wüttemberg in Germany, the University of Ghent in Belgium and the Baranya Country Museum at Pécs in Hungary. Also involved in the Culture 2000 project are the University of Lecce in Italy and institutions in a number of other countries of Europe

Who is the school aimed at?

The school is open to undergraduate and post-graduate students and to research workers, professionals and others, from Italy or abroad, who are involved in the study, management or conservation of archaeological sites and landscapes. The language of the school will be English. Participants will be required to attend **all** of the teaching and practical sessions throughout the school. The number of participants is restricted to twenty-four. Sixteen places have been reserved for a 'basic' course, aimed at those who are new to aerial archaeology. Eight places are available in an 'advanced' course, for those who have attended earlier schools, who already have some experience in the air or who make use of aerial evidence in their work or research.

Teaching programme

The 'basic' course will provide 20 hours of instruction in the theory and practice of aerial survey, along with 10 hours on photo-interpretation, 10 hours on mapping and GIS work, and 6-8 hours of

supervised experience in the air. The 'advanced' course will address more specialised aspects of aerial survey and its uses in archaeological, landscape and conservation studies.

Costs

The cost of the introductory lessons, practical exercises and flying experience will be covered by the Culture 2000 programme of the European Union and by the University of Foggia. Participants in the course will need to pay their own hotel and food costs at the Holiday Hotel in Foggia (estimated cost around 390 \in). An inscription fee of 100 \in will be payable to the Foggia Aeroclub for associate membership, insurance and a contribution towards fuel costs.

How to apply

Complete the application form, using the free space to give information about your university education and your ambitions or previous experience in aerial archaeology. Send the application form, along with a curriculum vitae, by email to <u>r.goffredo@unifg.it</u>. The absolute deadline for applications is 31st March 2007. The list of the participants accepted for the School will be published on the web site www.archeologia.unifg.it.

Course tutors

Tutors from Italy, Britain, Germany, Slovenia and Austria will illustrate the basic principles and practice of oblique aerial survey, photo-interpretation and mapping through lectures, discussions and practical exercises. A fundamental part of the 'basic' course will be flights and in-air instruction over northern Puglia, using light aircraft and pilots experienced in archaeological air survey.

Location and accommodation

The school will take place at Foggia, in the Department of Human Sciences at the University, at the Holiday Hotel and at the Foggia Aeroclub.
